Background:

Emergency proclamations were issued by Governor Newsom on August 5, 2021, August 10, 2021 and August 17, 2021 for the following counties effected by major wildfires: Siskiyou County due to the Antelope Fire; Nevada and Placer counties due to the River Fire; Trinity County due to the McFarland and Monument Fires; Tehama County due to the McFarland and Dixie Fires; Shasta County due to the McFarland Fire, and El Dorado County due to the Caldor Fire. The danger and damage caused by the fires has made it necessary for some families to evacuate their home counties.

Purpose:

The purpose of this special notice is to remind Human Services Specialists (HSS) of CalWORKs policies when processing applications received from wildfire victims and evacuees from the federally designated disaster or state declared emergency areas. The victims and evacuees may be eligible to waivers of CalWORKs rules.

Policy:

It is anticipated that some evacuees will apply for CalWORKs in disaster counties or counties other than those in which they reside, due to disaster-related relocation. Many evacuees will lack documentation of various items such as identity, age, social security number, value of property/resources, income, and may be unable to obtain such verification within standard application processing time periods.

When processing applications received from victims and evacuees in State or Federal declared emergency areas, HSSs must follow the guidance regarding waivers of CalWORKs rules as mentioned in the CalWORKs Processing Guide 40-100.E6.

CalWORKs rules regarding residency, income, property resources, temporary absence, work participation and SAR 7 reporting requirements also apply to Refugee Cash Assistance (RCA) and Trafficking and Crime Victims Assistance Program (TCVAP) customers.

Procedure:

HSS are encouraged to explore Immediate Needs, Diversion and Homeless Assistance eligibility for the wildfire evacuees. Diversion payments are designed to deal with a specific crisis situation or item of need and may be appropriate for displaced families.

When a CalWORKs application is received from an individual or family displaced by the wildfires, the HSS will do the following:

- Create the application in CalWIN
- Enter "Disaster CalWORKs" case special indicator
- Determine that the evacuee was living in a Federal or State declared disaster area during the period that the wildfires occurred
- Ask the evacuee if anyone in their family is currently receiving CalWORKs
- Process the application and complete the eligibility determination process
